Why do we care about waterborne disease?

- 3.4 million people die each year from water-borne diseases (world-wide).
- Between 1.8 million and 3.5 million Americans become sick every year from swimming in waters contaminated by sanitary sewer overflows.
- Combined, Americans take approximately two billion trips to the beach each year

Economic losses due to swimming-related illnesses are estimated at \$28,000,000,000 annually.




What is Rhode Island doing to prevent illness from swimming in contaminated bathing waters?

What Does the SWIM Viewer Tell Us?


- * Amount of Fecal Contamination in the Water * Precipitation

- * Daily Survey Data (birds, people, trash, weather etc.)



The SWIM Viewer was specifically designed for simplicity









- Click on a yellow dot to zoom into that beach




